Chairman's Report:

It was just 12 months or so ago we were again celebrating another successful season with promotions and silverware.

2017 in many ways has given us the starkest reminders that any clubs fortunes can change very quickly......

Success can be measured in many ways...... running a successful Youth Section, putting out 4 teams most weekends, having one of the best grounds around, having an extremely dedicated and selfless team of volunteers working tirelessly for the club and having a clear exit pathway from youth to senor cricket are all things we should be embracing and celebrating.

Against this there will always be things that stand out as a frustration for myself as Chairman and these will be on my agenda as the club looks forward to 2018 and beyond:

- Effective collection of senior player annual subscriptions (we have regular and habitual non-payers or late payers)
- Clarity about annual senior subscriptions and match fees
- Finding a way(s) to get much better support from across both youth and senior sections when jobs need doing (e.g. pre-season and end of season work on the ground) so much done by the few and so little done by the many....... (sorry folks just a very honest observation about the majority taking and giving nothing back)
- How the youth set up is better supported going forward.....we need to tap into the experience and knowledge of our senior players.......
- Retention of gifted and talented Youth Players, too many players and parents leaving as they
 perceive the grass is greener elsewhere we need to ensure our coaching programme meets the
 needs of these players, we need to challenge, nurture and develop players for the benefit our club
 not Winterbourne (we have good coaches doing an excellent job, but they are few and can't do it
 all without support).

So just a few things to keep us ticking over. The key word there is 'US'. It was just back in March I informed the management committee of my intention to stand down from the role of chairman at this year's AGM. At the time there was something of a hangover of the success of the past two seasons, the challenges of working full time outside of cricket, plus the demands of yet another cricket season to get through – to be blunt after nearly 20 years I was jaded and wanting to take a break.

After very careful consideration and having had a less involved season, it was knowing I can still make a positive impact at Hambrook CC that has forced a change of mind, feeling refreshed and looking for a challenge I will stand for re-election.

After 20 seasons involved in cricket at club, league and County level I'm pretty sure I have the knowledge and experience needed to fulfil the role of Chairman. If I don't know the answer to something I have the contacts and positive relationships within the various leagues, associations and at the Gloucestershire Cricket Board to ask for help when needed.

OK, let us move on, look forward into 2018 on a positive note and celebrate and wholeheartedly thank the individuals who selflessly give their time up for the club.

I would like to start with our three Saturday captains all of whom are standing down this year:

- 1st XI Lee Dyer with 2 promotions and a cup win there was plenty to celebrate. Unfortunately, the
 momentum didn't continue this year and a drop back into Division 1 for 2018. Off the field Lee has
 been busy with the bonus ball and raffle fundraising.
- 2nd XI after several years drifting, the 2nd XI stabilised and moved forward under David Branton. A promotion and a very credible 4th place in Division 8 sees the team well placed to push on again in 2018 and beyond.

• 3rd XI – they say a week is a long time in politics, if that's the case what is 10 years as captain for Rich Snell? In many ways the miracle worker in ensuring the team stabilised each year at their current level.

On Sundays I would like to thank James Wigzell for stepping in as captain. A much different dynamic this year with a lot of senior players not making themselves available. However, this allowed a sizable number of youth players to showcase their skills in a longer match format.

The Youth Section again ran numerous age groups under the guidance of Rich Carter. It was a mixed season with no U13's and the U17's having virtually no opposition to play against.

I'm sure Rich will pass on the relevant thanks in his report to all the team managers and coaches – I would simply seek to endorse these thanks from the management team.

Looking forward to 2018 I am hoping to be more involved with coaching – there are a few challenges for the youth section in terms of numbers and retention of gifted and talented players. My message to parents is we are a club for all and I want to build on the great work Rich and his team are doing. Key to this is having enough volunteer helpers. Mums & Dads your input is vital – if you fancy getting involved just let Rich know.

One group of people that can be missed when sending out the thanks are the parents of the Youth players – thank you everyone for bringing your children to the club, its hugely appreciated!!

To those that worked so tirelessly on the ground this year – Roland Allen, Nathan Warren, Aidy Kislingbury & Rich Snell being the main people.

To those that also helped when needed on the square and ground – Lee Dyer, Richard Dyer, Stuart Rutter, Rich Carter, Tom Yearsley someone called Martin Dyer (whoever he is?) – thank you.

Thank you to the ever-present Carol Dyer for scoring the 1st XI matches again in 2017. Also for your work in running the bonus ball again this year.

Also, a word of thanks for our Tea persons – Sarah Yearsley, Tracey Vardy and John Howe (and very nice they were too!!)

To Jon Snell who remains active behind the scenes producing the excellent match day programmes, being the quiz master for our quiz night and for raising nigh on £1000 per year from the 100 Club.

Lastly, my thanks go to the Management committee and Youth Section sub-committee in ensuring the club is well run and solvent. Especially like to mention the invaluable contributions made by our Treasurer Colin Carson and secretary Chris Millett.

Although not on the committee, thank you again to Nathan Warren for fulfilling the role of Fixture Secretary.

So, we look forward to 2018 with some degree of in trepidation. 3 new captains, if all goes to plan an overseas player and subject to his election at the AGM then Neil Higginson will be joining the management team as Vice Chairman. Neil will bring a huge amount of knowledge and experience to the club from both inside and outside of cricket. Thank you of course to Neil for all his support and guidance again in 2017.

If I have forgotten to thank anyone, I offer my apologies and thank you too.

2018 looks like it will start with some exceptional expenses – the replacement of the Site Screens will be circa £2000. Our application for an ECB interest Free Loan appears to be moving forward – this will help fund the replacement mower with trailing seat used for cutting the square. That said the club will still need to contribute about £1k (and repay the loan).

Whilst the 100 Club and Bonus Ball helps fund these items it won't leave a lot of contingency for any other items we may need – for this reason please do support any fundraising activities we run in 2018.

Similarly, help is always needed around the club — as already mentioned, youth section parents you can have such a positive impact by helping with umpiring, scoring, help run a training session alongside one of the qualified coaches, fundraising, run a BBQ on a Friday evening training. Likewise, if you would like to get involved in a more formal role then please do let us know—believe me there is a job for everyone!! Seniors, if you would like to get involved just put your hand up — no one will be turned away!! I would encourage people to get involved — so much more we can do if everyone helps — it would take a lot of pressure off the current volunteers.

To round off 2017, I was really pleased to hear a few weeks ago that Hambrook CC had been successful in its reaccreditation for ECB ClubMark. It means we have once again been benchmarked by the ECB/ Sport England and recognised as a sustainable, well run as well as providing a positive environment for our members.

Thanks, must go to the small team that were involved in this project over the past few months: Carol Dyer, Martin Dyer, Richard Carter plus Level 2 coaches Richard Dyer & Rory O'Connor. The whole project was coordinated by Youth Section parent Naomi Amos – everyone take a bow, its well-deserved!!

1st XI Report - Lee Dyer

Back to tier 4 after another great promotion. Win the 1st game, close encounter with Timsbury with us winning by a wicket last ball with Pete Davis scoring the winning run with myself at the other end 40 odd not out. This followed Pete's 1st 5 wicket haul for Hambrook. However, it seems maybe we were a little negligent and took things easier than we should have.

Over the course of the rest of the season things weren't as glamorous as they were the previous 2 seasons with the final game resulted us being relegated from tier 4. There were still a lot of positives to take from the season though. Firstly, we have an extremely young and inexperienced squad of players. This takes nothing away from their ability by any means as we have some superb players and the inexperience unfortunately cost us in some games. A few thanks before I end , thank you to the selection team we met every Tuesday during the season and it ran fairly smoothly, I must give a big thanks to Rich Carter , on many occasions Rich would be phoning around frantically getting us a couple of youths to play for us on a Friday night and Saturday morning it's a great help so thanks Rich, thanks to Michelle for preparing the teas on a few occasions she would be up all night working but still put together a superb tea, thanks to Colin Carson my vice-captain for standing in for me on 2 matches and for having the roll of collecting match day subs, finally thanks to everyone who played for me during the season , I think we all enjoyed it and we always played in the right spirit of the game and gave 100 % which is all you can do , Lastly this was my final season as captain , after 10 years of leading the 3rds I decided the time was right to hand over the baton to someone else, I have really enjoyed the last 10 seasons and to all who have played for me thank you, I wish my successor all the best and hope everyone gets behind him and gives him good support though the 2018 season.

Whilst results may not have been as favourable as in previous seasons, on the whole I believe that we did achieve a number of things this year. We also successfully integrated a significant number of junior players throughout the season. No fewer than six juniors made their first appearance in 'competitive' senior games for the club, with a further seven being involved throughout the season. I consider this to be the most encouraging aspect of the Sunday cricket season, and I hope that this can be sustained in the future.

There were also a number of personal highlights through the season, with three hundred's scored and one five wicket haul taken.

I would like to place on record my thanks as first time captain to all those who turned out, whether for one game or for the whole season. Special thanks to those who contributed to preparing the ground, because without these people there would have been no Sunday cricket for us to enjoy, and to those who helped me to find players on those occasions when it looked as though we would be struggling for numbers.

Youth Coordinator Report - Richard Carter

This season has been successful for the Youth Section, with excellent performances across the age groups and consistent displays of the spirit of cricket.

The Kwik Cricket under 9 section, under the excellent tutorship of Jaz Ahmed and Martyn Hall, has had more players turning up on practically a weekly basis. At the Chipping Sodbury festival, good performances were rewarded with a couple of excellent wins. Even more satisfying has been the number of U9s progressing and becoming involved in hard ball cricket. Extra thanks to Jeremy Yearsley for helping on Sunday mornings as part of his Duke of Edinburgh's award volunteering. For the U11s, the season was again positive, especially considering that several senior players from last season decided to play elsewhere. The league section was again challenging Bishopston and Thornbury both fielding strong sides with many county and district players. Despite this however the side was competitive in most games and was rewarded by wins over Old Down and Chipping Sodbury. In the cup competition, the Plate quarter final against Hanham was the culmination of a good run. It was a good season of development, and the skills of the group continue to develop. Next year we have a good core of U12 players and look to reintroduce the side.

In the cup, the run ended in the Quarter Final with a defeat to Downend, again a couple of dropped chances proving costly. With only 4 players moving to U17s next year, the core of the team hopefully can continue to improve and be strong next year. Thanks to Martin Richardson for marshalling the troops.

The U17s opportunity for cricket was limited by both Frampton and Pucklechurch dropping out of the section, leaving the league season at a straight play off with Carsons. In addition, the U17 cup draw was Carsons. Both matches were won comfortably, with good bowling from Jamie Kislingbury, George Huke and Jess Werrett restricting the home side to low totals. George Hanham in the league and George Weston in the cup knocked off the runs. The cup run ended at Downend with a disappointing batting display. The league play off semi-final resulted in a defeat to Winterbourne. Thanks to Jess Werrett and George Hanham, whom have now finished youth cricket for their many years of service.

In addition, once again the Youth Section contributed significantly in senior cricket over the season. Thanks to Lee Dyer, Dave Branton, Rich Snell and James Wigzell for their captaincy of the senior sides and support for the young players selected.
